

Poster Session Information

Each Sea Grant program is encouraged to prepare a poster that highlights either the 50th Anniversary Celebration or noteworthy research, education, or outreach project(s) that could help guide and inform other programs' efforts.

You are strongly encouraged to use creative and attractive designs for your posters, and to keep the text short. For general hints on graphics and posters, see Scientifically Speaking at the Oceanography Society website (www.tos.org/resources/publications/sci_speaking.html).

We welcome all posters, but to help us provide enough easels, poster board, and Velcro, we ask you notify us of your intent to bring a poster by Monday, September 26, 2016. Please email jwyman@rwu.edu with your intent to bring a poster.

Display

- Posters should be printed on either large paper or be laminated.
- Rigid foam core boards (36" by 48") may also be used but it is not necessary.
- We are using easels to display posters this year. Standard poster boards will be provided (48" x 48"). We will provide a limited supply of Velcro so you can fasten your poster to the board.
- Posters may be smaller than the dimensions provided, but should not exceed them. You may use the portrait or landscape format, but portrait is recommended.
- We suggest you print the poster on one large piece of paper (36" by 48"); it can be laminated or not.
- It is easy to transport if it is rolled in a tube.

Poster Session

- Poster setup is all day on Tuesday, October 11 in the Poster Display Hall adjacent to the ballroom.
- A formal poster reception will be held Thursday evening from 6:00 to 7:00 pm.
- Presenters are requested to be available for questions during the poster session.
- Posters must be removed during the Light Continental Breakfast Break on Friday, October 14, 7:30 - 8:30 am.
